





CDC: COVID VACCINATIONS HAVE SLOWED

Research shows Covid vaccine uptake has slowed among older adults. While 71% received the first recommended booster, only 44% have received the second one, the CDC reports. A study from the Kaiser Family Foundation found that 43% of people 65

and over were "not sure" or responded "no" when asked about a second booster. CDC data shows the new Moderna and Pfizer-BioNTech vaccines target both the original Coronavirus strain and some of the latest Omicron variants. The updated boosters are called bivalent vaccines, meaning two sets of instructions that teach the body to produce antibodies to fight off a coronavirus infection. New boosters can be administered two months after the last dose. The AAA is working with local health departments to provide vaccines and boosters for the homebound. COVID-RELATED INCREASED SNAP BENEFITS EXPIRING IN FEBRUARY

The temporary boost to SNAP benefits put in place during the Covid pandemic, known as emergency allotments, will end nationwide after the February 2023 issuance. In addition, households that receive SNAP and Social Security benefits will see a decrease in their SNAP benefits because of the significant cost of living increase to Social Security benefits that took effect in January. SS/SSI increased 8.7% in 2023.

The Alabama Senior Citizens Hall of Fame has honored and recognized Alabamians aged 60 or older for their outstanding contribution to the lives of older members in their local communities since 1983. Those selected as Permanent Members of the Hall of Fame are formally honored and recognized for their selfless advocacy and dedication of service to others at an official ceremony held in Montgomery each year. The 2023 Alabama Senior Citizens Hall of Fame nomination forms will be available March 1.

The Alabama Senior Citizens Hall of Fame also recognizes Alabama seniors who are 100 years or older and couples married 65 years or more.

In 2022, 6,500 prescriptions were filled in our region, saving clients \$7.5 Million.



Are you struggling to pay for your medications? Do you need help obtaining your medications? SenioRx is for the disabled (regardless of age) or those 55 and older who have been diagnosed with at least one medical condition that requires a prescription medication. Eligible clients may receive a three-month supply of medication from pharmaceutical companies FREE or at a LOW COST.

Qualifications


- 55 and older with a chronic medical condition, no prescription drug insurance coverage and meet certain income limits
- Deemed disabled (any age) by Social Security, have applied for disability, and are awaiting a decision, have a doctor's declaration of disability, or in the 24month Medicare waiting period
- Have Medicare and reached your Medicare Part D coverage gap (donut hole)
